

Sushen Memorial Scholarship Exam Class IV

The Sushen Memorial Scholarship Exam stands as a flagship initiative of OFINS, dedicated to recognizing and nurturing academic excellence among students from underprivileged families. This scholarship is awarded as a one-time honor to meritorious students, serving as both a recognition of their scholastic achievements and a means of encouragement for them to pursue their aspired career paths.

Each year, in average 600-700 students from Class IV take part in this prestigious examination. The exam is designed to assess the students' proficiency in three key areas: English, Mathematics, and General Knowledge.

The top 20 performers are awarded the scholarship, which symbolizes the first formal acknowledgment of their academic potential.



In the 22nd edition of the Sushen Memorial Scholarship Exam, held in 2023, a total of 528 students from around 45 primary schools across Barasat Block 1 and Block 2 participated. These young scholars demonstrated their talents and academic promise, earning the first significant recognition in their educational journey. The Sushen Memorial Scholarship not only highlights their achievements but also serves as a beacon of hope, inspiring them to continue striving towards their dreams.









Sushen Memorial Mock Madhyamik Exam Class X

The Sushen Memorial Mock Madhyamik Exam is an esteemed annual initiative aimed at supporting Class X students as they prepare for their first board examinations. For the past 18 years, OFINS has diligently organized this preparatory exam, providing a valuable platform for students to gauge their readiness and strengthen their confidence before facing the official board exams.

Each year, around 500 students from various schools participate in this rigorous assessment. In 2023, 421 students from six high schools in the surrounding localities took part in the Sushen Memorial Mock Madhyamik Exam. This exam serves as a critical tool for students to evaluate their preparedness and refine their strategies, ensuring they are well-equipped to perform their best in the final board examinations.

The Sushen Memorial Scholarship Distribution Program has been arranged on 16th Apr'2023. In 2022 also, the exam was successfully conducted and about 545 students of different primary schools sat in the said exam. We awarded 20 students with one time scholarships to motivate them to thrive in their future.

Chirayu: Homeopathic Heath Centre

Chirayu Homeopathic Health Centre is committed to providing modern, high-quality primary healthcare services free of charge to residents in the rural areas of North 24 Parganas district. CHIRAYU Unit-I, located in Badu Mathgram in Barasat Block-I, and CHIRAYU Unit-II, situated in Bilchaturiya, Gaighata Block, serve regions where conventional healthcare facilities are absent, leaving the local population in urgent need of accessible medical care.



Despite the rapid growth of India's healthcare sector, many rural areas still face significant challenges, including inadequate healthcare infrastructure, a shortage of medical professionals, substandard care quality, limited access to services, and the high cost of medicines and medical treatments. These factors, combined with a lack of awareness and the government distance to healthcare centers, make basic primary healthcare inaccessible to the underprivileged in rural India. The escalating cost of treatment further exacerbates this issue, leaving the healthcare needs of the rural poor largely unmet.

In response to this pressing social concern, OFINS has established rural health care units under the CHIRAYU initiative, providing essential healthcare services completely free of charge and within reach of the underserved communities.

CHIRAYU Unit-I was inaugurated in 2018, and since then, it has provided free healthcare services to a total of 4040 patients. CHIRAYU Unit-II, which began operations in 2021, has served 3512 patients to date. The year 2023-24 brought significant progress for both CHIRAYU centers, as outreach efforts expanded to additional neighboring villages, raising awareness of primary health issues. As a result, the number of visitors to our centers increased by 39%





Drishti Shakti: Free Eye Check-up Camp and Spectacle Distribution Program

OFINS has extended its commitment to community welfare through the organization of the Drishti Shakti Eye Camp, a vital healthcare initiative aimed at providing free eye care services and free spectacle distribution to underprivileged individuals in two different locations. This camp was strategically designed to reach communities with limited access to medical facilities, ensuring that essential eye care is available to those who need it the most.

During the course of the Drishti Shakti Eye Camp, 1000 patients received thorough eye examinations conducted by qualified ophthalmologists. These assessments included screenings for common vision problems, eye diseases, and conditions that, if left untreated, could lead to more severe complications. In addition to medical consultations, patients were provided with necessary treatments to address their specific eye conditions. For many, this included the provision of corrective spectacles, which were distributed free of charge.



The impact of the Drishti Shakti Eye Camp extends beyond the immediate benefits of restored or improved vision. Over 1000 individuals who received treatment, the camp has not only enhanced their ability to see but also improved their overall quality of life. Clear vision plays a critical role in daily activities, education, and employment, and by addressing these needs, OFINS is helping to empower individuals within these communities.

Drishti Shakti: Free Eye Check-up Camp and Spectacle Distribution Program

Furthermore, the Drishti Shakti Eye Camp exemplifies OFINS' holistic approach to community development. By addressing healthcare needs in conjunction with its other initiatives, such as the AGNIK Academy of Sports, OFINS is fostering a healthier, more vibrant community. The organization recognizes that good health is foundational to personal and communal growth, and through initiatives like the Drishti Shakti Eye Camp, it continues to make a tangible difference in the lives of those it serves.



We are determined to carry on with this project in future also because a great number of underprivileged people living in remote places, do not even know that they are suffering from lack of vision. The camp was organized against the commitment of OUR FRIENDS IN NEED SOCIETY to provide easy & free of cost eye care service for the weaker section of society.

Agnik Academy of Sports

Agnik Academy of Sports was established to nurture and promote talented yet underprivileged children from rural areas, enabling them to excel at the national level in various sports disciplines. The academy provides modern, high-quality coaching for a range of sports at no cost, empowering these children to pursue a career in sports. AGNIK is dedicated to creating opportunities for young talents to engage in sports, receive professional training, and develop their skills from an early age. The academy serves as a crucial intervention tool, mobilizing children, youth, and communities through sports.



However, grassroots sports development in India faces several significant challenges. Limited access to quality coaching, inadequate infrastructure, and a lack of funding and resources are among the key hurdles that must be overcome. Additionally, societal and cultural barriers, gender disparities, and the preference for traditional career paths often hinder the promotion of sports as a viable and respected profession. In response to these **OFINS** challenges, initiated **AGNIK** Academy of Sports to identify and develop talents from rural areas, promoting sports across all segments of society. This inclusive approach not only fosters greater participation but also creates employment opportunities.

Currently, the academy is training 70 boys and 22 girls in football, along with 15 students in athletics. Our students have participated and excelled in various tournaments, including the Senior and U-15 & Junior U-13 football competitions organized by the North 24 Parganas District Sports Authority. The year 2022-23 was particularly successful for our academy, with five students being selected for U-14 & U-16 football teams in different AIFA-listed premier football clubs (I-League & ISL clubs) in West Bengal, and two students winning medals at the State-level Athletic competition.







Sports Meet 2024

The 8th Inter-School Sports Meet 2024, held on February 10th, 2024, at Badu Agrani Playground, was a grand celebration marked by immense enthusiasm and fervor. The event witnessed the participation of approximately 350 students from more than 22 diverse institutions, including primary and junior high schools.


The success of the 8th Inter-School Sports Meet reflects the commitment to nurturing young talent and instilling a lifelong appreciation for sports and physical activity among children.
